### **CHILDLINE 1098**

CHILDLINE is a national 24 hours free phone emergency outreach service for children in need of care and protection. It responds to needs of children and links them to long-term services. The CHILDLINE number 1098 is a toll free number that is common in all cities in India. It responds to needs of children and links them to long-term services. CHILDLINE is currently operational in 91 cities.

### 1.1 Overview of CHILDLINE Shillong activity

CHILDLINE Shillong started on July 2001. Since its inception, CHILDLINE Shillong has played a very remarkable role in every aspect, where it responds to every child who dials 1098 and provides emergency assistance through intervention and long-term follow up.

#### **Operational Strategy:**

The Collaborative Organizations respond to all incoming calls, 24 hours a day and provide the necessary assistance. The Collaborative Organization must also respond when a concerned adult informs it about a child in need of care and protection.

The primary role of the CHILDLINE Nodal Organization is to ensure effective networking and training of organizations associated with CHILDLINE. The nodal organization ensures that the issues faced in responding to calls are addressed for effective functioning of the service.

CHILDLINE India Foundation is the nodal agency appointed by the Ministry of Women and Child Development, Government of India to facilitate, monitor and implement CHILDLINE service through partner organization through the country.



1.2 Location of CHILDLINE office (Geographical area covered under CHILDLINE Shillong



CHILDLINE being a city-based programme covers the entire Shillong city from G.S. Road to Ladumsaw, from Shra Road to Mylliem, from Nongstoin Road up tp Mowngap, from Jowai Road to Ladsmith and from NEIGRIHMS TO Mawlynrei, delivering services as per the protocol and intervening the cases as and when received. Although, CHILDLINE is a city-based programme, but at times, it does intervene cases received from beyond its jurisdiction depending on the urgency of the cases.

CHILDLINE Shillong has stepped towards the 9<sup>th</sup> year of its functioning in Shillong and has played a remarkable role towards addressing the needs of children in distress.

**CHILDLINE Case Intervention:** CHILDLINE Shillong's intervention calls to 1098 comprises of providing medical assistance, linking children to shelter, restoring children home, tracking missing children, intervening with children who has been physically or sexually abused, providing sponsorship and other interventions related to child rights violations. Provided below is the table highlighting the intervention case statistics of CHILDLINE Shillong from the time of its inception in Shillong in 2001 till December 2010:

**Cases intervened by CHILDLINE Shillong:** CHILDLINE aims at protecting the rights of Children and ensuring access to quality service to the poorest of the poor children. Keeping this in view, CHILDLINE Shillong has been able to render quality service to children calling 1098 for mental help, repatriation, death related, emotional support and guidance, protection from abuse and sponsorship.



### 2. MAJOR HIGHLIGHTS AND HAPPENINGS

**3.1. CAB meetings:** CHILDLINE Shillong has conducted a total of 9 (nine) CAB meetings between the period 2001 to 2010 during which important issues were discussed and decisions were taken.

However, two CAB meetings were held during April 2009 to December 2010 whereby various issues pertaining to children were discussed and decisions were taken accordingly.



CAB meeting held on the 16<sup>th</sup> of February 2010 at the Conference Hall, Main Secretariat Building, Shillong, Meghalaya

Provided below are the issues discussed and decided and follow-up done by CHILDLINE Shillong towards the implementation of the decision taken in the said meeting

#### CAB Meeting held on: 16<sup>th</sup> February 2010

#### **Issues Discussed**

- The meeting was attended by 29 participants comprising of Government Officials, representatives from various NGOs/Agencies/ Associations and Interns besides CHILDLINE Team.
- Implementation of ICPS: The Honourable Chief Secretary Shri. W.M.S. Pariat, IAS directed the Social Welfare Department to follow it up and expedite the process. The time-frame so set was one month. He further directed the department to complete signing of MOU within the financial year i.e. 2009-2010.
- Presentation by Social Welfare Department on the statistics of cases intervened by respective CWCs and JJBs in the state during the period 2008-09.
- Shelter Home for Mentally and Physically Challenged children: The Honourable Chief Secretary directed the Department of Social Welfare to call a meeting with all the NGOs working in the disability sector so as to find a specialized way to tackle the issue and the fund required for it.
- Setting up of Special Juvenile Police Unit (SJPU): Mr. B. R. Rana, Inspector General of Police, CID, and Police Department confirmed the setting up of SJPUs in all the Police Stations of all the districts of Meghalaya. He assured that he will provide all the details concerning the matter to CHILDLINE very soon.
- Police Department issued directions to all the District Units as to the procedures and modalities of handling the missing children cases.



- The department has also written to the BSNL for a toll free number for the purpose of reporting missing cases.
- As for street children addicted to dendrite sniffing, the Honourable Chief Secretary promptly asked I.G.P CID to look into the matter.
- Since a huge number of children are found working in the coal mines, therefore, Mr. Arindom Som, IAS Commissioner & Secretary, Social Welfare Department as well as Mining, assured to do the needful pertaining to drafting of Meghalaya Mining Policy.
- Ms. M. N. Nampui, Labour Commissioner, Meghalaya shared that her Department has issued and circulated public notice to all the shops and working places warning against the employment of children in hazardous occupations.
- Task Forces for taking up driving tasks for rehabilitation and monitoring of child labours have been formed by Labour Department.
- For awareness about the Child Labour Restraint Act and the penalties provided in the Act, the Honourable Chief Secretary asked CHILDLINE and Labour Department to supply the required materials to DIPR immediately.
- He further asked DIPR to organize a meeting with the Press and other media and interact on the issue.
- Sharing on cases of children who are unable to afford the cost of schooling. Measures to link them up through programmes under SSA.
- Sr. Judith Shadaap, Executive Director of WISE Social Service Centre urged by Government support to NGOs towards rehabilitation of children.

CAB meeting held on the 8th of December 2010 at the Conference Hall, Main Secretariat Building, Shillong, Meghalaya





The issues discussed and decisions taken are provided below:

- The CAB meeting held on the 8<sup>th</sup> of December 2010 was attended by 25 participants from Allied Systems and also esteemed public organizations besides the team of CHILDLINE Shillong.
- Sharing by the Social Welfare Department on the status of the implementation of ICPS in the state of Meghalaya confirming that before winter holidays begin, there would definitely be some positive result regarding the implementation of ICPS in the state. All the necessary documents has been prepared and submitted to the Government of India as per the guidelines provided by the Centre. The department would be holding a meeting on the 13<sup>th</sup> or 14<sup>th</sup> of December 2011 to speed up the process towards implementation of ICPS.



- Labour Department has been conducting regular inspections and that till September 2010, a total of 95 inspections were made to check child labour.
- The Department of Labour has taken the initiative towards creating mass awareness on Prohibition of Child Labour for which the department has printed pamphlets in three different dialects i.e. Khasi, English and Hindi and these pamphlets contain detail information about "The Child Labour (Prohibition and Regulation) Act 1986" in the interest of public service. The pamphlets have been distributed to Jaintia Hills and to the Sub-Division Khlieriat as these are coal mine concentrated areas.
- As regards the rehabilitation package for the child labours, Labour Department has sent the proposal for National Child Labour Project (NCLP) that would support rehabilitation of the child labour.
- The Chief Secretary Mr. W. M. S. Pariat asked the Labour Department to circulate and distribute the pamphlets to other areas of Meghalaya as well, so as to sensitize a large group about prohibition of Child Labour
- Mr. Arindom Som, Commissioner and Secretary, Social Welfare Department informed about the series of meetings Meghalaya Government had with National Commission for Protection of Child Rights (NCPCR) concerning the issue of children in the coal mines of Jaintia Hills, Meghalaya.
- He informed that as per the preliminary report submitted by the Government of Meghalaya based on the survey conducted in 18 villages, the number of children working in the coal mines is only 222.
- Moreover, NCPCR has asked the Meghalaya Government to coordinate with the Education Department for the rehabilitation of children working in the coal mines. Moreover, the Deputy Commissioner is also asked to conduct a detail inquiry of the same with the help of Police Department.
- District Commission has issued order to the Labour Department to visit the coal mines in Jaintia Hills and verify whether there are children employed in those mines.
- Labour Department was asked by the Chief Secretary to intensify the publicity campaign on Child Labour (Prohibition and Regulation) Act 1986 and that, the actual prosecution should start by the beginning of 2011 thereby prosecuting those found guilty as per the provision of the law.
- Police Department proposed for a collaborative approach between Police Department and Labour Department to address the issue of child labour promptly and effectively
- The Honourable Chief Secretary said that CHILDLINE Shillong may take the initiative to report the cases of child labour to Labour Department besides reporting the matter to the concerned CWC.
- The State Police Website developed by the Police Department which is a Central Data Bank for information. The website also contains information about missing children and there is an investigating officer to trace the missing children in particular.
- Department of Social Welfare shared about the meeting with all the concerned NGOs working in the field of disability to address the issue of Shelter Home for mentally and physically challenged children. Acknowledging the crucial need to impart education to these children, the department would take up the matter with SSA for providing special education to the children with disability.
- District Social Welfare Officer of different districts of Meghalaya asked to take the initiative to identify NGOs working in the field
  of disability in their respective districts and call for a meeting to address the need of the destitute children with disability in their
  respective districts.
- To address the need of De-addiction Centre for children affected by dendrite sniffing and other drugs, the Chief Secretary asked the Social Welfare Department to revise the proposal submitted by Kripa Foundation. He asked the department to take CHILDLINE, Kripa Foundation and Health Department in the board to address the issue and come up with recommendations.



- Dr. A. Laloo, Joint DHS (M) was glad to coordinate and extend the support of the Health Depart towards other concerned departments/agencies and CHILDLINE as well, in creating awareness about the ill-effects of using alcohol, hard drugs and dendrite sniffing.
- For induction of a new member from the legal background into CAB as per the need, the Chief Secretary will ask the Law Department to identify someone to be in the CAB to assist CHILDLINE for legal intervention of cases.
- The Chief Secretary asked Social Welfare Department to prepare the Minutes of the said meeting as well so that a small review meeting could be held with the concerned departments and CHILDLINE to address minor issues.

3.2. **Open house:** Open House is an open forum for children associated with CHILDLINE to address conflicts, assess, review and evaluate the service. It allows space for the CHILDLINE team along with the children to identify solutions to problems.

CHILDLINE Shillong too has been conducting open house regularly thereby having an interaction with the children and understanding their problems so as to get it resolved accordingly.



During the period April 2009 to December 2010, CHILDLINE Shillong conducted a total of 12 numbers of open house at different localities targeting different groups of children such as school going, non-school going, drop-outs and others belonging to different age-groups. During these, various issues were highlighted such as CHILDLINE, Child Abuse and Child Trafficking with special reference to Child Beggary, Organ trade, Flesh trade, Child Sexual abuse and how to protect themselves. Importance of education, health and hygiene, Food, Nutrition & Cleanliness, etc was also given importance. Moreover, important information was disseminated among the children concerning free services available for the community and about the ICDS Scheme and how it could be availed.

Besides, a platform was provided to the children whereby they shared about their life situation for sharing. Moral values were also inculcated during the open house being conducted. Most of these 'open house' concluded with games, songs, recreational activities and jokes as a part of entertainment for the children.

**3.3. Outreach & Awareness:** Outreach for CHILDLINE is an everyday feature. Members of the CHILDLINE team go out on the street and create awareness about CHILDLINE. This direct method of reaching out to children is the strongest method of getting the CHILDLINE message through, especially to children





Awareness in CHILDLINE is an integral part of CHILDLINE. CHILDLINEs success is measured not just by the number of calls in a city but also by the levels of awareness. The primary focus of CHILDLINE awareness to make the 1098 number known to children, show them how to call and built their confidence in



**CHILDLINE** Shillong has been rigorously involved in conducting outreach and awareness on a regular basis creating awareness on CHILDLINE 1098 services and other children related issues.

During the period April 2009 to December 2010, the team devoted more than 241 days going for outreach and awareness to different localities and areas targeting market places, taxi stands, slums, PCOs, individuals, shops, bank, Police Stations, etc sensitizing the masses about CHILDLINE and the services rendered by it through the number 1098.

As a part of awareness programme, Poster Campaign on child trafficking was carried out in all the Police Stations in Shillong thereby sensitizing the police personnel about the prevalence of child trafficking in the state and collaborative effort required to address the menace of trafficking. Film screening on child trafficking was also carried out in many of the educational institutions in Shillong while poster campaign on the same was carried out in more than 30 schools in Shillong. Poster campaign on child trafficking was also carried out in the public places as well.





Apart from this, skits were developed based on child labour, domestic work and child trafficking which were performed in a number of schools as well as in public places.



The skits were based on child labour and trafficking issues which happened to be the most important and burning subject at the moment. The teachers as well as the students appreciated the skit performed and very well received the message that was intended to pass to them. The Principal of the schools too gave impressive feedbacks which are recorded in the reports.

The skits were performed in more than 10 schools during the period 2009. A follow-up of the same was carried out through awareness programmes in various schools in Shillong during 2010.

Besides these, other activities that were carried out as a part of CHILDLINE awareness include one-toone awareness, community awareness, and awareness in banks, Ward Lake, orientation to the school teachers, community leaders, headmen and other pressure groups.

**3.4. NICP workshop:** National Initiative for Child Protection (NICP) is a campaign initiated by the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment through the National Institute of Social Defence (NISD) and CHILDLINE India Foundation (CIF).

NICP aims to build partnership with the Allied System for protection and promotion of Child Rights.

As per the aim of NICP, CHILDLINE Shillong too has been conducting NICP training for different target groups from time to time based on the felt need of CHILDLINE Shillong.



CHILDLINE Shillong has conducted four (4) numbers of NICP Training during the period April 2009 to December 2010 as per the NICP guidelines. The trainings were organized by NISD in collaboration with CHILDLINE India Foundation (CIF) and CHILDLINE Shillong and supported by NIPCCD.

Provided below are a few of the messages published in newspapers and CHILDLINE message printed in the BSNL Telephone Bills.




### 3.7. Special Events (CHILDLINE SE Dosti Week, Birth Day Celebration of Shillong CHILDLINE etc):
